TOWNSHIP ZONING & CODE COMPLIANCE

Oscoda Township is a zoned community and maintains an enforceable zoning ordinance. Permits are required for all construction activities; signs, fences, garages, sheds just to name a few. Oscoda Township residents will be provided the opportunity to dispose of large household refuse items (furniture, carpet, computers, appliances, etc.) on September 12th from 8am - 2pm at 4775 Sunset St (Sunrise Disposal). A \$10 permit must be obtained at the Township Treasurer's Office prior to the scheduled event. Program is open to Oscoda Township residents only. 

Election Dates and Deadlines

By June 20, 2020	County clerks deliver absent voter ballots for the August primary to local clerks.
July 20, 2020	Last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk for the August primary.
By 5:00 p.m., July 31, 2020	Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot via First Class mail.
Up to 4:00 p.m., August 3, 2020	Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot in person in the clerk's office.
Up to 8:00 p.m. August 4, 2020	In-person registration with local clerk with proof of residency.
August 4, 2020	State Primary Election
By September 19, 2020	County clerks deliver absent voter ballots for November general election to local clerks.
By 5:00 p.m., Oct. 30, 2020	Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot via First Class mail.
Up to 4:00 p.m., November 2, 2020	Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot in person in the clerk's office.
Up to 8:00 p.m. November 3, 2020	In-person registration with local clerk with proof of residency.
November 3, 2020	State General Election

Election Changes and Updates

Automatic and Election Day Voter Registration

With the passage of Proposal 18-3, individuals become automatically registered to vote when applying for, updating, or renewing a driver's license or state-issued personal identification card, unless the person declines. Also, individuals may simultaneously register to vote with proof of residency and obtain a ballot during the 2-week period prior to an election, up to and including Election Day.

No-Reason Absentee Voting

Also, with the passage of Proposal 18-3, individuals may obtain an absent voter ballot without providing a reason.

Registered voters can be placed on the township's permanent absentee voter list. Once you are added to the list, you will automatically receive an application for an absentee ballot approximately six weeks prior to each election. Straight-ticket voting

In addition, with the passage of Proposal 18-3, Individuals may cast a straight-ticket vote for all candidates of a particular political party when voting in a partisan general election.

Methods of voting the partisan section of the ballot now include:

Straight Ticket: Vote the party of your choice. Nothing further need be done in the partisan section.

Split Ticket: You may vote a straight ticket AND vote for individual candidates of your choice.

Mixed Ticket: Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office.

Election Inspectors

Election inspectors are always needed for elections. You must be a registered Michigan voter and be willing to declare a recognized political party preference. This is a paid position at \$11.46 an hour. Paid mandatory training is provided.
